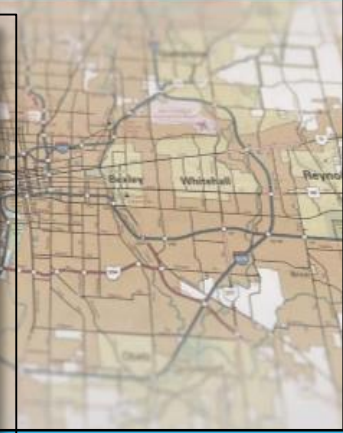
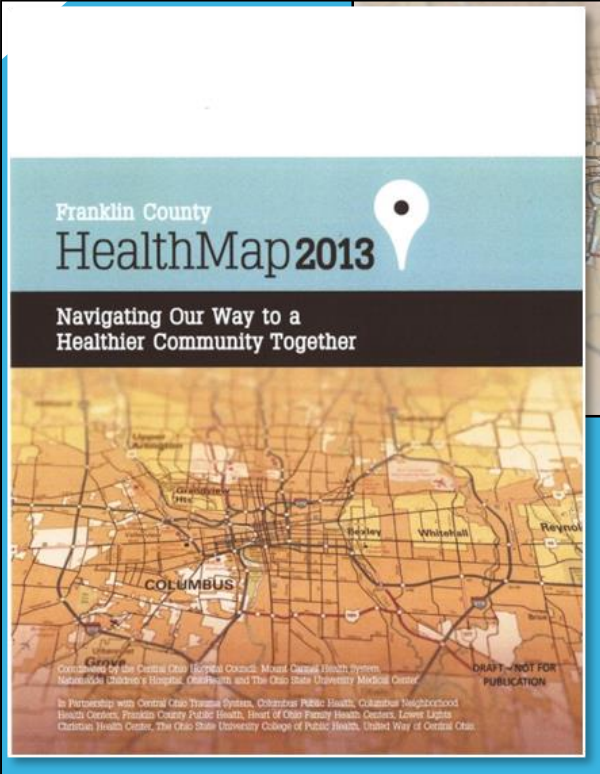

AFFORDABLE CARE ACT

IRS REQUIREMENTS

- 501C3 hospitals must conduct a community health needs assessment and implement a strategic plan, based on assessment, every 3 years
 - Must partner with Public Health and a university, where available
 - \$50,000 penalty (or loss of tax exemption) for those not in compliance

NEXT STEPS

- Hospitals obtained approval from Governing Boards
- Released HM 2016 – June 2016
- Hospitals developed implementation strategies (individually and collectively) to address identified health needs
- Needs assessment posted to Websites: strategies submitted to the IRS and ODH

MENTAL HEALTH & ADDICTION

Mental Health Bedboard

Since 2008, inpatient psych providers, Netcare, TVBH, ADAMH working to place ED patients in an inpatient psych bed in a timely manner.

Opiate Task Force

Collaborate with Coroner's Office and neighborhood organizations to coordinate community overdose education and prevention programs in key neighborhoods.

Support education of prescribing professionals on the risks of opiate over-prescribing.



INFANT MORTALITY

CelebrateOne Work Plan

Early Elective Deliveries

- Hospitals prohibit scheduling deliveries before 39 weeks without a medical reason

Safe Sleep

- Educate patients and care givers on safe sleep environments

VLBW Infants

- Ensuring VLBW infants are delivered in facilities with higher volumes of delivering these infants

Medical Legal Partnership

- Refer pregnant women who have legal needs to Legal Aid, when appropriate

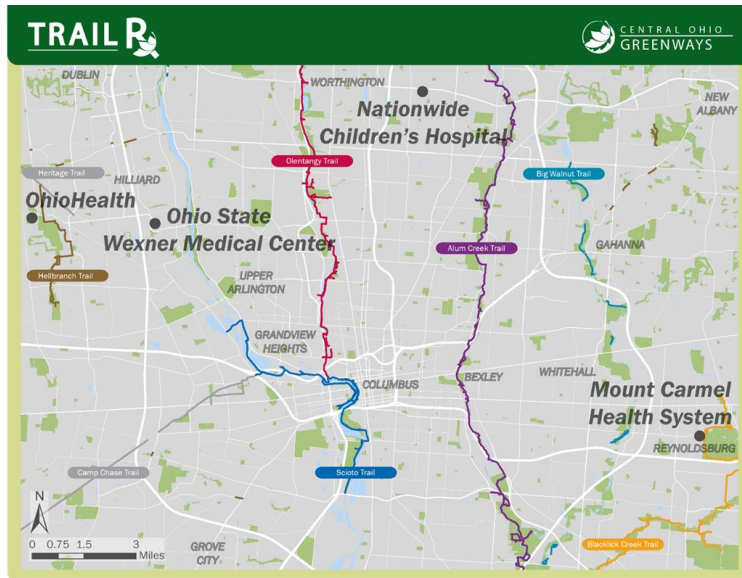
Tobacco Cessation

- Refer women to Ohio Tobacco Quit Line, if they are willing to make a quit attempt



OBESITY

Central Ohio Trails Rx Initiative



- COHC, Columbus Public Health and MORPC initiative
- One primary care site per system
- Clear, written prescriptions for physical activity by walking the Trails
- Provide handout to patients about the benefits of walking and the different trails around Central Ohio
- Patient check-ins on usage on weekly physical activity, check BMI

HEALTHMAP 2019

Steering Committee Work

- Identify indicators for inclusion in HM 2019
- Identify and prioritize Franklin County unmet health needs
- Identify potential partners who can assist in addressing health needs
- Provide guidance and feedback on the process

NEW THIS GO-AROUND

Alignment between Hospitals and Health Departments

- **CHAs (LHDs) & CHNAs (Hospitals) are completed in alignment every 3 years**
 - **Metrics used in CHNA are consistent with those used in health department plans and state plan**
 - **2 health priorities must be in the State Health Improvement Plan**
