Equal Access to Quality Care for All Residents

Central Ohio is the only known community in the United States where hospitals follow the same charity care policy, where all residents, regardless of the ability to pay, receive the same quality of care at all of our hospitals. Franklin County hospitals' uniform policy ensures that all residents receive free, medically necessary hospital care if their family incomes are under 200 percent of the federal poverty level, or \$62,400 for a family of four. These patients do not receive a bill for their care. Patients with family incomes up to 400% of the poverty level, or \$124,800 for a family of four, are provided significant discounts.
